Pond 1

Comments:

Pond 1 looks great.

Previous treatments have maintained little to no new growth of invasive plants or weeds. Previous shoreline weed treatments have also resulted in little to no new growth observed. No issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds.

Fountain was operational.





Pond 2

Comments:

Pond 2 looks good. This is one of the ponds recommended for stocking of the Triploid Grass Carp.

Previous treatments for algae and submersed weeds have slowed and controlled the amount of new growth observed on this pond. No issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds. Pond 2 has seen a vast improvement of the past couple of months.





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Site Assessments

Pond 3

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

A minimal amount of the submersed weed Slender Spike Rush was observed on pond 3 around the shoreline perimeter. This will be targeted during the upcoming visits. No issues were observed with algae or shoreline weeds.

This is one of the ponds recommended for stocking of the Triploid Grass Carp.





Pond 4

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

A minimal amount of algae was observed. A one foot band of algae was observed in some areas of this pond. Algae will be targeted during the upcoming visits. No issues were observed with submersed weeds or shoreline weeds.





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Site Assessments

Pond 5

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

A minor amount of algae was observed around the shoreline perimeter in a few areas and will be targeted for treatment during the upcoming visits. No significant issues were observed with submersed weeds. Shoreline weeds were previously treated and positive results were observed.

This is one of the ponds recommended for stocking of the Triploid Grass Carp.





Pond 6

Comments:

Normal growth observed.

A very minimal amount of algae was observed on pond 6. This minor amount of algae will be targeted during the upcoming routine maintenance visits. No issues were observed with submersed weeds or shoreline weeds. This is one of the ponds recommended for stocking of the Triploid Grass Carp.





Fountain was operational.

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Site Assessments

Pond 7

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

A very minimal new growth of algae and Slender Spike Rush was observed. This will be targeted during the upcoming visit to help keep new growth to a minimum. Overall pond 7 still looks good and has improved very much compared to a few months ago. No issues were observed with shoreline weeds.





Pond 8

Comments:

Pond 8 looks good.

Previous algae treatments have shown positive results in reducing the algae present and minimizing new growth. No issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds.

Fountain was operational.





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Site Assessments

Pond 9

Comments:

Pond 9 looks good.

Previous algae treatments have shown positive results in reducing the algae and minimizing new growth. No significant issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds. Shoreline weeds were previously treated and positive results were seen.

This is one of the ponds recommended for stocking of the Triploid Grass Carp.





Pond 10

Comments:

Pond 10 looks good.

The water level has dropped and is below a normal level. No issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds. Some undermining on concrete apron was observed. Recommend addressing this issue promptly with CDD Engineer since this sites water level fluctuates it could exaggerate this issue quickly.





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Site Assessments

Pond 11

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

A very minimal amount of algae was observed. In a few small areas around the shoreline line bands of algae one foot or less were observed. This new algae growth will be targeted during the upcoming visits. No issues were observed with submersed weeds or shoreline weeds.





Pond 12

Comments:

Pond 12 looks good.

This site is currently dry. Other than no water being present this site looks good and no issue in this site were observed. A potential issue that was observed was that the water feature above this pond has Watermeal. We will quickly determine how we can best address this issue.





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Site Assessments

Pond 13

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

An extremely minimal amount of algae was observed. Overall pond 13 looks great, but a small patch of algae was observed. This will be targeted during routine visits to limit this new growth. No issues were observed with submersed weeds or shoreline weeds.





Pond 14

Comments:

Pond 14 looks good.

This pond continues to look good after the previous submersed weed and algae treatments. No significant issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds. The shoreline weeds were also treated previously and positive results were seen.

This is one of the ponds recommended for stocking of the Triploid Grass Carp.

Pond 15

Comments:

Pond 15 looks good.

Previous treatments have targeted shoreline weed growth. No issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds.





Pond 16

Comments:

Pond 16 looks good.

Previous treatments have targeted shoreline weed growth. No issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds.





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Site Assessments

Pond 17

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

Overall pond 17 looks good. A minor amount of Slender Spike Rush was observed growing on the exposed sediment in various spots around the shoreline. Overall this new growth is minimal, and will be targeted during the upcoming visits to limited continued growth. No other issues were observed with algae or shoreline weeds.

This is one of the ponds recommended for stocking of the Triploid Grass Carp.





Pond 18

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

Overall pond 18 looks good. A minor amount of Slender Spike Rush was observed growing on the exposed sediment in various spots around the shoreline. Overall this new growth is minimal and will be targeted during the upcoming visits. No other issues were observed with algae or shoreline weeds.

This is one of the ponds recommended for stocking of the Triploid Grass Carp.





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Site Assessments

Pond 19

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

A minimal amount of Slender Spike
Rush and algae were observed in a few
locations around the shoreline
perimeter. This new growth will be
targeted for treatment. No other issues
with shoreline weeds were observed.
This is one of the ponds recommended
for stocking of the Triploid Grass Carp.





Fountain was operational.

Pond 20

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

A very minimal amount of algae was observed. This new growth was limited to shoreline perimeter in just few spots growing no more than just a few inches off of the water's edge. This new growth will be targeted for treatment. No issues were observed with submersed weeds or shoreline weeds.





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Site Assessments

Pond 21

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

Overall pond 21 looks good. A very minimal amount of Planktonic algae was observed. This new growth will be targeted for treatment. Shoreline weeds were previously treated and show positive results. No issues were observed with submersed weeds or shoreline weeds.





Pond 22

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

Over all pond 22 looks good. Only a few small patches of Slender Spike

Rush were observed. This new growth will be targeted for treatment during the upcoming visits to prevent this growth from expanding. No issues were observed with algae or shoreline weeds.





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Site Assessments

Pond 23

Comments:

Treatment in progress.

The previous treatment of Slender Spike Rush on this pond has resulted in this specific plant uprooting and floating in the pond. Most of the Slender Spike Rush is in the early stages of decomposition and will continue to decay. Follow up treatments will be performed to further accelerate this process.





Pond 24

Comments:

Pond 24 looks good.

No issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds. The water level has dropped to below a normal level. Shoreline weeds were previously treated in this pond and have shown positive results.





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Site Assessments

Pond 25

Comments:

Pond 25 looks good.

During today's inspection no issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds. Shoreline weeds were previously treated and positive results were seen.





Pond 26

Comments:

Normal growth was observed.

Overall Pond 26 looks good. A very minimal amount of new algae growth was observed. This new growth was primarily in just one spot and in a very limited amount. This new growth will be targeted to keep new growth at a minimum. No issues were observed with submersed weeds or shoreline weeds.

Pond 27

Comments:

Pond 27 looks good.

Previous shoreline weed treatments were performed and positive results were observed. The water level has remained at a normal level. No issues were observed with algae, submersed weeds, or shoreline weeds.





Pond 28

Comments:

Pond 28 looks great.

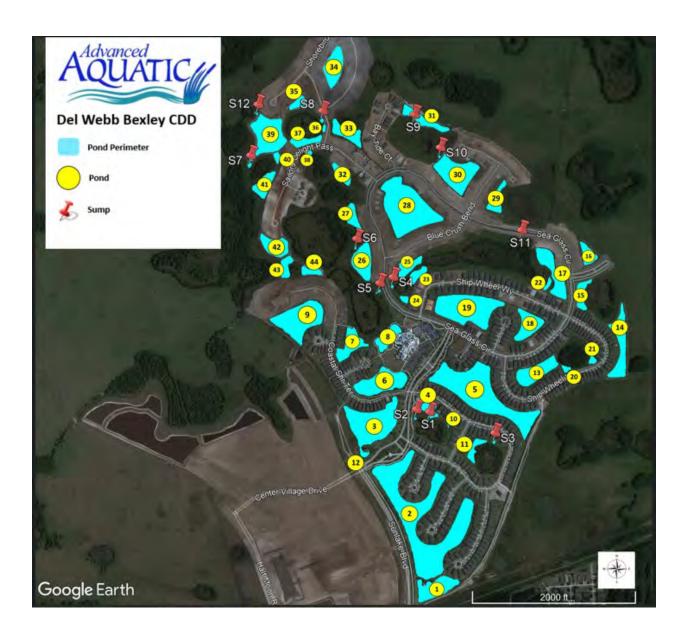

- 3) CUSTOMER agrees to pay AAS, Inc., its agents or assigns, the following sum for specified environmental services:

In the event that CUSTOMER does not directly own the areas where services are to be provided, CUSTOMER warrants and represents that he had control of these areas to the extent that he may authorize the specified services and agrees to hold AAS, INC. harmless for the consequences of such services not arising out of AAS, INC.'s negligence.
- 9) Neither party shall be responsible in damages, penalties or otherwise for any failure to delay in the performance of any of its obligation hereunder caused by strikes, riots, war, acts of God, accidents, governmental order and regulation, curtailment or failure to obtain sufficient material or other cause (whether or not of the same class or kind as those set forth above) beyond its reasonable control and which by the exercise of due diligence, it is unable to overcome.



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Mr. Hayes presented the Rizzetta District Management Services Contract to the Board of Supervisors.

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A. Aquatics Report

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Mr. Agnew presented his report. Mr. Agnew noted to the Board of Supervisors that January or February would be an ideal time to stock additional Triploid grass carp at selected stormwater ponds determined and provided by Florida Fish and Wildlife.

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C. District Engineer

He provided a narrative outlining the erosion issues from the initial dewatering through the present for the developer to fix a mitered end section in pond 2. Mr. Hayes commented to the Board of Supervisors that he had a conference call with Mr. McDermott, Mr. Brletic and Mr. Dugan to discuss this matter and as requested Mr. Brletic provided an updated report showing the erosion damage at pond 2 as of August 4.


